

Jordi Aladro (Barcelona, Spain) received his PhD in Spanish literature from SUNY Albany, after which he held a post-doc at The Boccaccio Institute at Yale. Presently a professor of Literature at the University of California Santa Cruz, he has given talks at many universities, research institutes and cultural foundations across the Americas, Europe and Asia, and was in 1997 the first scholar invited by the Chinese government to give a seminar on Cervantes.
