

Professor Butts is an Associate Professor in the Department of Semitic and Egyptian Languages and Literatures at The Catholic University of America. His research is focused on the languages, literatures, and history of Christianity in the Near East, especially Syriac as well as Arabic and Ethiopic. He has wide-ranging interests in ancient Christianity, spanning across a vast time period (from the New Testament to the early Islamic period), traversing an extensive geographic expanse (from Rome to Mesopotamia and beyond), and crossing diverse languages (including Greek, Syriac, Arabic, Ethiopic, and Coptic). At CUA, he serves on the Executive Committee for the Center for the Study of Early Christianity and is director of the Institute of Christian Oriental Research. Dr. Butts serves on a number of editorial boards, including *Hugoye: Journal of Syriac Studies* and *Journal of Semitic Studies*, and he is co-editor of *Aramaic Studies*, as well as its *Supplements* series. He has published, as author or co-author, five books and edited another four, in addition to publishing over fifty articles.

In 2019-2020, Dr. Butts had a Mellon Fellowship at the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, NJ, and in 2020-2021 he was awarded an Alexander von Humboldt Research Fellowship.
