

Ronald Simkins is Professor of Hebrew Bible and Near Eastern Studies in the Theology Department at Creighton University in Omaha, Nebraska. He received his Ph.D. in Near Eastern Languages and Civilizations in 1990 from Harvard University, and has spent the thirty plus years since on the faculty at Creighton University. His teaching and research has focused on the Hebrew Bible, and he has published widely in the areas of political economy, creation, gender, and the environment. He has brought all these areas together in his recently published third book, entitled, *Creation and Ecology: The Political Economy of Ancient Israel and the Environmental Crisis* (Cascade Books, 2020). He also teaches the archaeology of Israel and Jordan, and early in his career he would take students to Israel to participate in archaeological digs. Subsequently, he developed the Virtual World Project as a teaching resource. It is online website that provides interactive virtual tours of over one hundred archaeological sites in Israel and Jordan. Professor Simkins also directs the Kripke Center for the Study of Religion and Society at Creighton University, and is the founding editor of the open-access *Journal of Religion & Society*.
